



LOVE IN THE TIME OF COVID

The series that you are about to view was successfully exhibited for the first time in Washington DC, with an opening reception on Valentine's day 2021.

"Love In The Time Of Covid" is a communal visual diary reflecting the desire for love and intimacy during the coronavirus pandemic. The initial inspiration came to the artist during an early morning run, as she reflected upon conversations that she have had with different people in her community, within the DMV area.

The artworks that encompass the entire series were created through the dynamic process of instinctual and automatic painting. When viewed as a whole, the collection "Love In The Time Of Covid" appears to the eye as a surreal collage that weaves individual experiences and desires, into a whole communal novella. The color palette is consistent throughout the series; the four base colors are metallic gold and silver, red and blue. The metallic gold represents the novelty of love, the metallic silver the sultriness of intimacy; the blue and the red are more suitable for basic emotions arising from love or lack of.



Artistic Style & Inspiration: Abstract expressionism, geometric art, Jungian active imagination.

In the HeartMath study, *The Electricity of Touch*, researchers set out to determine whether the heart's electromagnetic field, as measured by an electrocardiogram (ECG) in one individual, could be detected and measured in another person when the pair either were seated about three feet of each other, or held hands. The results of The Electricity of Touch experiment were positive: The data showed "when people touch or are in proximity, a transference of the electromagnetic energy produced by the heart occurs," -The HeartMath Institute

This artwork was inspired by an unintended comment a young woman made during a happy hour gathering where the artist was present. As the covid-19 quarantine had just finished and with social distancing keeping folks at an arm's length, the young woman (obviously intoxicated by alcohol), let a comment slip in front of all who were present and paying attention, "I have enjoyed watching different people having sex." Where and under what circumstances the young woman was engaging in voyeuristic behavior, remains a mystery to this day.

This artwork was inspired by a conversation that the artist had with a married couple towards the end of the covid-19 quarantine. As the artist shared her love for Rock Creek Park and discussed the amount of people flooding the park during the quarantine period, the couple shared details of their love-making sessions in Rock Creek Park, Washington D.C.



Title: The Blue Balls Of Love and The Untouchable Lips of The Beloved

Artistic Style & Inspiration: Abstract art, Jungian active imagination.

Why is it that some women do not desire to be intimate with their husbands after childbirth or after many years of partnership? During the first year of covid, the artist heard various women talked about their lack of sexual desire for their partners (mostly men); likewise, the artist also heard the stories of male friends who talked about wanting to make love to their wives and got rejected. During the summer of 2020, a woman told the artist that she was going to refuse love-making with her man as some sort of punishment... A male friend present during the conversation smiled and said, "I was married for 30 years and my wife tried the same practice after childbirth; I found a solution."



Title: Shhh ... I'm Sleeping with Prostitutes (and they're all sweet!).

Motif: Sexcapades, Covid quarantine reflections.

Artistic Style & Inspiration: Erotic art, Abstract expressionism, Jungian active imagination.

(This painting pairs with the previous artwork).

This piece was inspired by a conversation that the artist had with someone in her community, whose spouse decided to explore abstinence during their marriage, while asking him to remain sexless. When the artist asked him how he was handling the situation, he replied with a mischievous grin, "Shhh... I'm sleeping with prostitutes - and they're all sweet!"

Media: Acrylic on stretched canvas.



Media: Acrylic on stretched canvas.






